ACCESSIBILITY STATEMENT (WEBSITE) 2019

Using the website

This website is run by Horton in Ribblesdale Parish Council. We want as many people as possible to be able to use this website. For example, that means you should be able to:

- change colours, contrast levels and fonts
- zoom in up to 300% without the text spilling off the screen
- navigate most of the website using just a keyboard
- navigate most of the website using speech recognition software
- listen to most of the website using a screen reader (including the most recent versions of JAWS, NVDA and Voice-over).

We have also made the website text as simple as possible to understand.

We know some parts of this website aren't fully accessible:

- the text won't re flow in a single column when you change the size of the browser window
- you can't modify the line height or spacing of text
- most older PDF documents aren't fully accessible to screen reader software
- you can't skip to the main content when using screen reader
- The Parish Council is continually working on these issues to improve the performance of its website, enabling access for all.
